

Dr. MiUndrae Prince – Asst. Supt./Federal Programs

H. MiUndrae Prince, Ph. D., joined the Kansas City, Missouri School District (KCMSD) as **Assistant Superintendent for Federal Programs/Chief Compliance Officer** in September 2009.

Prince is a native of Orangeburg, S.C., and a graduate of South Carolina State University, where he received his undergraduate degree in English education with a minor in Spanish. **He began his teaching career as a high school English teacher in Darlington, S.C., and later taught English at Lower Richland High School.** As an English teacher, he was twice nominated by his peers as **Teacher of the Year**. After teaching English at Lower Richland for three and a half years, he was promoted to assistant principal, where he served for five years.

In 1999 after taking a one-year sabbatical to complete the requirements for his doctoral degree at the University of South Carolina, he was appointed principal at Columbia (S.C.) High School. **During his second year as principal, he earned a Doctorate of Philosophy degree in Educational Administration from the University of South Carolina in 2001.**

As principal of Columbia High School, Prince worked tirelessly with staff, community and students to improve the academic performance of all students, thus making it one of the highest performing schools in the district and state.

Prince served as principal of Columbia High School until 2005, when he was appointed as the **state coordinator for “High Schools That Work,” a whole school reform initiative based in Atlanta.** In that position, Prince worked with more than 150 high schools across South Carolina on the implementation of the key practices of the initiative, all of which would result in improved student achievement in those schools, many of which were Title I or low performing schools. During the implementation of the reform initiative and under Prince’s leadership, student performance at high schools throughout the state improved greatly as evidence on state and national assessments.

Prince has served on many statewide committees and is a member of a number of professional organizations including the National Association for Secondary School Principals, the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, Phi Delta Kappa and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc. He also served as an adjunct professor of Educational Administration at South Carolina State University.
